Any service person who has taken the gravest risk should not have to worry where they will sleep tonight. That's why housing veterans in crisis is at the core of our mission.



In 2021, we doubled down on our commitment to stabilize housing for the most vulnerable veteran families in a social and economic climate ravaged by the acute and chronic effects Covid-19.

Risk factors for homelessness among veterans like PTSD, social isolation, unemployment, mental health issues, and substance abuse were all exacerbated by the pandemic, greatly increasing the need for emergency assistance through our Homes For the Brave program.

Housing stability provides a strong foundation for our clients. It helps build the confidence they need and allows them to pursue pathways to success, like increased income. That in turn contributes to the success of our community as a whole, proving that the impact of this program is not just transactional but transformative, with long-lasting effects.

This numbers presented in this report demonstrate what we have known all along: your support makes a lasting impact in the lives of our nation's heroes and their families. Loyal supporters gave time, talent, and money, supported events like Mondays Dark and our annual Salute to Veterans golf tournament, shared social media posts, walked with us in the Veterans Day parade, helped build hygiene kits, and so much more. 

MEET COLEMAN.

Coleman is a decorated combat veteran who served two tours of duty in Iraq and came home with a traumatic brain injury, limiting his ability to work.

He came to us for assistance just before Thanksgiving. His application read: "I'm embarrassed to have to ask for help with our rent, but maintaining a stable environment for my kids means I have to put aside my pride."

Can you imagine making the sacrifices required of this Army vet and still ending up homeless? We couldn't let that happen. We made sure this family's rent was paid through the holidays, and together with a generous partner, provided a fully decorated Christmas tree, a holiday dinner with all the trimmings, and wrapped gifts for the children.

Coleman started a new job a few weeks later and the family remains stable in their home. He said: "I never expected to receive this type of blessing. I was just as excited as the kids. Thank you for helping my family and for letting me feel like a father again."

Your support makes it possible for Coleman and veterans like him to get the help they need, without shame or judgement.







